The posted hours of operation are:

These hours are subject to change by the bartender's discretion, if there is nobody in the lounge, with no, or few players remaining on the course. Keeping a full staff in the kitchen for a late group of stalwart golfers isn't cost effective or practical. To that point, we have added a new "After Hours Menu," that will be served after the kitchen closes, but members are still lingering, looking for food and beverage.

The Green Report

We had a very nice Fall, however it appears that the winter weather is now here to stay. This time of year, we have many days following heavy rains where allowing carts on the course is marginal.

Due to the fact that the rough becomes wet quickly, while the fairways remain firm from years of sand topdressing, we have a "modified 90 degree rule." This cart rule is simply to enter the fairway 90 degrees from the path and then remain on the fairway the entire time you play the hole, until you exit the fairway and go back to the cart path near the green. The goal is to minimize cart traffic in the wet, rough areas and utilize the firmer fairways as much as possible.


