

### **New Score Cards & Tee Markers**

### Fewer Options...Which Tees Are Best Suited to Your Game?

At first glance, when picking up one of the new score cards, those of a certain age are reminded of the album covers for Metallica, AC/DC or even the hilariously obscure black album cover from the ill-fated Spinal Tap. But there was a method to the "reductionist" design of our new cards, and even more important. the resulting reduction in tees for our course.

First, the ideas behind the stark design of the card. The intent was to make the cards similar to the cards used on the PGA/LPGA circuit, which are rela-

tively devoid of adornment. The Pros in the Golf Shop, as well as members who serve on the Golf Committee were involved in the design, but may opt for reversing colors (white card, more color) on the next round of cards.

The reduction in tee markers will certainly be even more talked about, but has a logical reasons for the changes. With our old system, we had six different tee markers; gold, red. white, green, blue and black, as well the addition of silver and family tees. Far too often, the grounds crew found themselves duplicating the placement of tee markers (green often with white or blue, red and gold often in the same location), with the resulting handicapping nightmare attached



The current standardization of the tee markers is far more conducive to complying with other courses, especially those which are of championship caliber, such as ours. Black, Blue, White, and Red tees are common to most courses, and help standardize our handicapping.

The biggest hurdle for our members to overcome with the new tee markers, is accepting the fact that tee designation has little or nothing to do with age or gender, but is tied to an individual player's handicap and golf ability. Gold was never intended to represent "Senior Tees" any more than Red was meant as "Women's Tees." Green Tee players did so, because they didn't hit as long as blue tees, but longer than white tees, but in actuality, shared tees with both. Redundant in practice, at best.

Welcome to the start of the handicap posting season for 2023. The official start date is March I, 2023. As we usher in the 2023 posting season, I would like to re-introduce your Club's Handicap Committee. The committee members are; Addie Vandehey and Linda Robertson (Women's co-Chairs), Ron Willis (Men's Handicap Chair), Steve Mason and Tom Onstad (co-Chairs).

It is the responsibility of the Handicap Committee to ensure the integrity and accuracy of all the handicaps of those golfers at Shadow Hills who play competitive golf. Two basic premises underlie the World Handicap System; each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round and that player will post every acceptable round (nine or 18 holes) for peer review. In addition, rounds when played under the Local Rule of Preferred Lies (due to unfavorable playing conditions) must always be posted. By accomplishing these objectives, our competitive play and events will be equitable and more enjoyable for all who play. In advance, we would like to thank you for your anticipated cooperation and support.

It is also the responsibility of the Handicap Committee to make available and post the Club's Handicap Policies and Procedures. Our 2023 Handicap Policies and Procedures will be available on the bulletin board over the posting computer and will be sent to members by way of ForeTees. March is here and the golf season is about to begin! Just a reminder, we start posting scores Wednesday, March 1st. If you do not have an established handicap and would like to get one started, please check with the golf shop and we can help you get signed up.

This is the fourth year of the new World Handicap System. Please pay close attention to Ron Willis's article this month detailing the main objectives of the World Handicap system and posting scores.

There will be times throughout the spring that Preferred Lies (Winter Rules) will be in effect, so as a reminder the OGA and the USGA says you still POST ALL YOUR SCORES. However, the Golf Committee and Handicap Chairpersons, who handle all handicap related issues, can make the decision to delay posting scores during the month of March if the weather does not cooperate and the course conditions are not conducive to posting scores. Check with the golf shop before your round.

The 9-Hole and 18-Hole Women's Spring Openers will be held in April again this year. We have found that in April participation is up and the weather is better. Stay tuned for details. However, there are two exciting events slated for March. Thursday, March 16th, we will have the Men's Chili Feed/2-Man Scramble. Sunday,March 19th, is the Couples' Irish Open which will be a 12pm shotgun start. A special Irish dinner and awards to follow. You can sign up through ForeTees or call the golf shop for further details on these events.




## Women's Club Updates by Trish Johnson President-Elect/Publicity

**BLACK** - The championship tees (back tees) are for low-handicap men.(5 handicap or lower)

BLUE- Women's Championship or men 5-10 handicap WHITE- middle to high handicap men 10-20, low-handicap or long-hitting women, and lower-handicap or long-hitting senior men

RED- The forward tees are for middle or high handicap women and seniors, and beginners of all stripes. SILVER/FAMILY TEES- Are for younger players, as well as beginners of all ages!
